Evelyn Chabot, 89, passed away on February 11, 2018 at the Merrimack Valley Hospice House in Haverhill, MA. She had been a resident of the Lakeview House Nursing Home for the past five years where she was lovingly cared for. Evelyn was born to the late Joseph and Yvonne (Bourgeois) Chabot in Lawrence, MA on March 4, 1928. Evelyn is survived by her dear friend of many years, Linda Callagy of Hampton, NH. She is also survived by several nieces and nephews. Evelyn was preceded in death by her life-long friend, Irene Hodgkinson, her sister, Rita and by her brothers Henry, Raymond, Richard and Ronald.
